

NCSC TRAP RANGE RULES

It is the responsibility of every shooter to know the rules and practices of proper gun safety. Therefore, prior to using the range, you must read and sign this form acknowledging that you understand the requirements and agree to abide by those procedures. Violation will result in ejection from the range.

1. Always make sure firearms are pointed in a safe direction.
2. Only one shell is to be loaded at a time, unless shooting doubles. Some people will try to put 3 to 5 shells in their pumps or automatics. This is NOT allowed.
3. When changing stations, guns will be empty, actions open, and pointed in a safe direction. (Empty means EMPTY! No live shells, no empty shells, nothing!)
4. Do not close the action until you are ready to shoot.
5. No high-based shells are permitted.
6. No shot larger than 7½ is permitted.
7. No loads over a 3¼-dram equivalent, unless it says “Handicap Load”.
8. When range safety lights are on (indicating someone is downrange) all guns are to remain in the gun racks with actions open. Absolutely no guns will be allowed on the shooting line.
9. No shooting is allowed after the consumption of alcohol.
10. No alcohol is allowed on the range.
11. Eye and hearing protection is required for all shooters.
12. Safety violators will forfeit their current round of trap and be asked to leave the range.
13. If there is a trap safety officer on duty, they shall have the final say in all matters.
